As part of your final assessment, your task is to <u>research your own ethnic community in Canada</u> (Ontario Social Studies curriculum expectation A3.7). Please remember to use the **skills learned during Research Week** (choosing sources, note-taking, citing your sources correctly).

You will submit a typed report, at least 2 pages long (maximum font size 12, Times New Roman or similar serif font).

Please answer the following questions:

- 1) When did members of your community first arrive in Canada?
- 2) What were their experiences like? Are there any primary sources of information (e.g. journals?)
- 3) What were some of the struggles they went through? Did they suffer any kind of discrimination?
- 4) What has their time in Canada been like since then? What are some of your community's accomplishments and successes?
- 5) Do you face any discrimination now? Is there anything noteworthy in contemporary times?
- 6) Who are some members of your community who have made special contributions to Canada? (e.g. artists, lawyers, politicans).
- 7) A half-page reflection on what it means to be part of your ethnic community but also a proud Canadian. Can you be both? Please elaborate!
