Grade 6 will In'shaa Allah be a challenging but rewarding year for all of us. The Grade 6 curriculum is full of many exciting and intriguing topics such as the Solar System and Flight, and it will be a busy year as we cover familiar areas and explore new ones. In addition, we will be doing the <u>EQAO test</u> in early June In'shaa Allah, so the entire year will have us preparing in one way or the other for it.

How will we have a successful year?

- 1. Remain organized. You will see very early on that I am VERY keen on remaining organized and expect the same from you. You should have binders for each subject (it's up to you whether you want to combine subjects) and all papers and handouts must be put in your binders the same day. I will be <u>conducting binder checks every two weeks</u> to make sure you are neat and organized In'shaa Allah. No scrunched-up papers at the bottom of your backpack!
- 2. Do your homework! This is something I will be quite strict with. Fill out your agenda carefully every day and make sure you get your work done. Each time homework is not completed, a 'Caught empty-handed' slip must be filled out. After three slips, a call will be made home to parents. Consistent issues with homework will result in speaking with the principal and department head, Br. Nizam.
- 3. Ask for help if you need it. I am always willing to give you extra help in any subject I teach, and Math remedial is set aside for Mondays and Wednesdays, 3:30-4:15 pm. Even if I do not select you for remedial help, feel free to stay behind and get the extra reinforcement if you feel you need it! Br. Osman (Language and boys' Physed/health teacher) is also very friendly and willing to help In'shaa Allah.
 - Remember, you need to take responsibility for your learning! I will help you in any way I can, but you need to be willing to seek help In'shaa Allah!
- 4. <u>Stay positive!!</u> 6B will In'shaa Allah be a place where we cheerfully work together to grow as leaders and students. It may get tough (especially when preparing for EQAO), but as long as we stay optimistic and keep making du'aa, we will do amazingly In'shaa Allah!






To begin the day, we will be participating in Daily Physical Activity (DPA), D.E.A.R. Reading Program or Numeracy Initiatives, depending on the day.


Science and Social Studies

We will be using a variety of textbooks and workbooks for this subject, including "Al Khilafah Ar-Rashidah."

Health and Physical Education
